David wrote this psalm of lament when the Philistines seized him in Gath (1 Sam 21:10).

This psalm is similar to Psalms 54, 55, 57.

1-3 David calls for God's help and explains why he needs it.

5-6
David explains how the enemy is twisting his words to harm him.

David does not want the enemy to go unpunished for their sins.

David's picture of God is as one who keeps a score of right and wrong.

10 God's Word is a vow to man.

12 Just as God made a vow to man, man should make a vow to God.

Psalm 56

Fear and Faith (1-4)

- ¹Be merciful to me, O God, for men hotly pursue me; all day long they press their attack. ²My slanderers pursue me all day long; many are attacking me in their pride.
- ³ When I am afraid, I will trust in you. ⁴ In God, whose word I praise, in God I trust; I will not be afraid. What can mortal man do to me?

Destroyer and Deliverer (5-9)

- ⁵ All day long they twist my words; they are always plotting to harm me. ⁶ They conspire, they lurk, they watch my steps, eager to take my life.
- ⁷ On no account let them escape; in your anger, O God, bring down the nations.
- ⁸ Record my lament; list my tears on your scroll-- are they not in your record? ⁹ Then my enemies will turn back when I call for help. By this I will know that God is for me.

Trust and Thanksgiving (10-13)

- ¹⁰ In God, whose word I praise, in the LORD, whose word I praise-¹¹ in God I trust; I will not be afraid. What can man do to me?
- ¹² I am under vows to you, O God; I will present my thank offerings to you. ¹³ For you have delivered me from death and my feet from stumbling, that I may walk before God in the light of life.
